



## D2Xchange, LLC Celebrates 5<sup>th</sup> Anniversary – A Colorado Business Success Story

D2Xchange, a Denver-based provider of document scanning, data archiving and content management software services, celebrates its fifth anniversary this month. Incorporated under the name D2Xchange, LLC, in October 2006 by co-owners [Nancy J. Sauer](#) and [Graham J. McClean](#), the company's roots stretch back to 1993 when the organization first opened a scanning bureau in the Denver Tech Center under the name Document Imaging. Its history documents a true Colorado business success story.

"While document [scanning](#) was a fairly novel concept 18 years ago, our company has firmly established its expertise in helping organizations to convert their hardcopy documents to electronic images in order to make information easier to share and store and to create a secure document archive for disaster recovery and business continuity," says Nancy Sauer, president and co-owner of D2Xchange. "This is particularly true for healthcare providers, financial services organizations, manufacturers and educational institutions."

"At the same time, we were establishing our expertise in document scanning and indexing, we began a business partnership with one of the country's largest payroll services providers," says Graham McClean, chairman and co-owner. "Through that partnership we have developed a proficiency in [data archiving and collaboration](#) with an emphasis on payroll and financial data."

Under the name D2Xchange, LLC, the company archives millions of company and individual employee payroll records each year. D2Xchange has also developed:

- Online applications to host payroll records
- Applications that allow company employee's to access their paystubs and W2 forms online

Other data archiving and collaboration solutions D2Xchange has created include an online software application that oversees treasury management funding of accounts of customer checking accounts while providing robust, on-demand reporting capabilities, as well as a secure archive for check images and associated meta data.

As a natural extension of their document conversion services, the company began offering [document management software](#) to customers in 2003. Under the name D2Xchange, the company has created a specialized niche in helping behavioral health and other medical services providers to content enable their electronic medical records systems by integrating document scanning and content management software.

"We have also introduced an integrated scanning/document management solution that allows customers to utilize touch screen technology to scan paper documents directly to e-mail, fax server, printer, network folder or electronic repository," Sauer says. D2Xchange leases approximately 7,000 square feet of office and has created jobs for approximately 20 people in the Denver Tech Center. The company has been profitable since its inception.
